Guest: Bob Townsend, Candidate for State Representative spoke about his campaign and qualifications.

Public Comments: Marty Ruggirello and Barbra Lambdin both questioned the little flags that have been on the roadsides. It seems both Charter and a geological survey crew have been in the area.

Committee Reports: Denise Goodenow, Planning Commission Chair stated the commission met on April 12th and will meet again on May 10th. Grant work for the park continues. There was a Public Hearing held on April 12th regarding changes to Section 21 (Dwelling Standards) of the Hamilton Township Zoning Ordinance with no public comments. Goodenow requested the board approve the changes. LaBoda moved to adopt a resolution to accept the changes, supported by Duby, roll call vote, all in favor. MC

Mark Janeczko, Zoning & Blight Enforcement reported he has issued 4 permits and has been busy with blight enforcement. The Starkweather case continues and a son-in-law is now involved with the clean up. Mark also mentioned the Kirtland Warbler Festival coming up in Roscommon on June 4th.

New Business: Scrap tire collection will be August 13. Discussion on getting the new section at the cemetery on Hover completed. Duby moved to allocate \$300 for weed control and fertilizer and pay \$160 for labor, supported by Iutzi, all in favor. MC

Old Business: The siren sounded on scheduled today. Brining is scheduled for June 2nd. Estimates for adding more crushed stone to the parking lot will be gathered.
