BOARD MEETING MINUTES

Date 9/5/19

CALL TO ORDER/PLEDGE OF ALEGANCE 6:30PM Guest Count 2 Resident Count 16

Present: Conway, Duby, Iutzi,, Wright Absent: LaBoda

Wright moved to approve the agenda, supported by Duby, All in favor. **MC**

Treasurer's report read by Duby, motion to approve by Iutzi, 2nd by Conway All in favor. **MC**

Reading of August minutes, motion to approve (with correction of Planning Commission date of public hearing from August 16 to 13) by Conway 2nd by Duby All in favor. **MC**

Invoices read, motion to approve and pay bills including incoming bills by Iutzi, 2nd by Duby All in favor. **MC**

Guest: Mark Fitzpatrick, County Commissioner, discussed problem areas in balancing the budget including cuts and/or possible millages in the future.

Gary Hicks, Republic Services, stated we still should be recycling and wants to educate people on what should and should not be placed in recycling bins. Questions and discussion on what is happening with recyclables in China and Canada. Residents in attendance complained about some issues, including problems with recycling driver, spilled trash and winter problems.

Public Comments: Dave Cooper asked about weed control in the cemetery. Weed control service was not put in the budget. Dave also asked about progress on the township park and Courtney Park. Arrangements are in progress to move equipment purchased from Amble to here. He also raised concerns about the need for brush to be cut on the corner of Townline and Athey. The county is responsible for cutting brush. **Charlie Fry** raised concerns about too much salt on his roads. **Barbara Lambdin** thanked Gary Hicks for attending and suggested with winter coming we might get someone to speak on fire and chimney safety.

Linda Barkell, Planning Commission Secretary stated they met on August 13 and are working on amendments to ordinances and rules and regulations on solar panels. Changes will be tabled until next month.

New Business: Tina Braman, Township Assessor gave a presentation on a program that would map parcels that would be beneficial for zoning, taxes, planning and accessing. The cost is \$8,500. More research will be done on the use and benefits and the budget will be looked at for possible purchase of the program in the future.

Mark Janeczko, Zoning & Blight Enforcement stated 7 building permits, 2 camping permits and one ticket were issued. Blight complaints are ongoing and there are concerns about a Mud Bog on Lilly Lake Rd.

Old Business: Dollar General is progressing nicely and all zoning and sign requirements have been met. Siren sounded.

Conway moved to adjourn at 8:33, supported by Wright, all in favor. **MC**
